## Volunteer with VCE Summer Tutoring



**VCE Summer Tutoring** is a not-for-profit charity that delivers a two-week program in January 2026, designed to support high school students from disadvantaged backgrounds to prepare for their VCE years.

The program is facilitated by volunteer university students and attended by senior high school students aged 16-18 years. Day Program activities are intended to take place in the Melbourne metropolitan area, with venues yet to be confirmed.

A Residential Program may run alongside the Day Program, with venues to be confirmed. This provides accommodation for students who may experience difficulties in attending the program due to the cost of travel.

## This role must be held alongside the Volunteer Academic Tutor role.

Role Title	Specialist Role Coordinator (SRC)
Purpose	Contribute to program delivery and volunteer skill development by managing a team responsible for a key aspect of program delivery.
Time Commitment	<ul> <li>Minimum of 33 hours between 26 September, 2025 and 31 January, 2026, including: <ul> <li>4 hours during Specialist Role Coordinator Training in September and October.</li> <li>5 to 10 hours training and organising Specialist Role teams prior to the program.</li> <li>3 hours on Tutor Refresher Day 3 January, 2026.</li> <li>15 hours during the program 5-16 January, 2026.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
Location	The 2026 program is planned to take place in the Melbourne metropolitan area, with venues to be confirmed.  Some planning and training may occur either in-person or online.
Key Responsibilities	Volunteers are required to follow all relevant policies, including engaging appropriately with students, preparing adequately for program commitments, and following program rules and procedures.  Before the program:

	<ul> <li>Attend Specialist Coordinator onboarding training run by Program Directors</li> <li>Collaborate with Program Directors to develop strategies for coordinating and upskilling your team</li> <li>Introduce your team and prepare them for tasks during the pre-program and program periods</li> <li>Set up lines of communication with your team and use these to plan meetings and work together on common objectives</li> <li>Perform the duties of your Specialist Role as necessary</li> <li>During the program:         <ul> <li>Develop rosters as necessary and communicate with your team what their responsibilities are and when these should be carried out</li> <li>Maintain a regular presence to offer support and advice to your team whenever needed</li> <li>Initiate meetings and daily debriefs to collect progress updates on the accomplishment of team goals and prepare for future</li> <li>Escalate any problems or concerns to Program Directors as necessary</li> </ul> </li> <li>After the program:         <ul> <li>Attend a debrief meeting organised by the Directors to share reflections on the program</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
Training & Support	Specialist Role Coordinators may be required to participate in a unique training session introducing them to their leadership position.  Ongoing support will be available throughout the program.
Key Benefits	<ul> <li>Adaptability and time management</li> <li>Experience in a leadership and mentoring role</li> <li>Opportunity to play a pivotal role in a program dedicated to improving the accessibility of education</li> <li>Experience in supporting and developing a key aspect of program delivery</li> </ul>

Eligibility and Selection Criteria	Volunteers are required to hold a valid Working with Children Check (WWCC) and have completed six months of tertiary study, or have previous experience with the program, before commencing their roles. This role must be held alongside the Volunteer Academic Tutor role and the Specialist Role you are coordinating.  As at the effective date, there is no cost involved in applying for a Volunteer WWCC in Victoria.  Other desirable attributes:  • Experience in a leadership position • Communication, organisation and reliability • Ability to work well in team environments under pressure with tight deadline
